
## Yellowstone Announces Lottery for 2023-2024 Non-Commercially Guided Snowmobile Access Program

MAMMOTH HOT SPRINGS, WY – Beginning Tuesday, Aug. 1, people may apply to the 2023-2024 winter lottery for permits to snowmobile in Yellowstone National Park without a commercial guide. Authorized in 2013, the Non-Commercially Guided Snowmobile Access Program allows permit-holders to enter the park for up to three days with a group of up to five snowmobilers.

This year's lottery will be open on <a href="www.recreation.gov">www.recreation.gov</a> from Aug. 1-31, 2023. Successful applicants will be notified in early September. Unclaimed or canceled permits will be made available via <a href="www.recreation.gov">www.recreation.gov</a> on a first-come, first-served basis beginning on Oct. 1, 2023. There is no waiting list. Cancellations may occur throughout the winter season, so check the website often for openings. Trips can be for a maximum of three days in length and permits cost \$40 per day with a \$6 application fee.

Permit holders are considered non-commercial guides and must be at least 18 years old on the first day of their trip. All snowmobile operators must possess a state-issued driver's license and successfully complete the free online Yellowstone Snowmobile Education Certification program. Anyone can take the course to learn about park rules that help visitors safely enjoy the unique experience of winter in Yellowstone while also protecting park resources. All snowmobiles must meet the park's New Best Available Technology standard.

## Nonnative Brook Trout Discovered in Soda Butte Creek in Yellowstone National Park; Native fish Restoration Project Resumes to Remove Nonnatives

Temporary creek closure Aug. 14-18

MAMMOTH HOT SPRINGS, WY - Yellowstone National Park, in coordination with Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks and Custer Gallatin National Forest, will resume the Soda Butte Creek Native Fish Restoration Project near the Northeast Entrance Aug. 14-18 to remove newly discovered nonnative brook trout. The fish restoration project concluded in 2016 after nonnative brook trout were completely removed from the waterway due to successful treatments. If not addressed this month, brook trout will quickly displace native Yellowstone cutthroat trout and eventually invade the entire Lamar River watershed, threatening the largest remaining riverine population of Yellowstone cutthroat trout in existence.

Aug. 14-18, Soda Butte Creek will be closed to the public from the park boundary at the Northeast Entrance to Ice Box Canyon (9.6 miles) while biologists remove brook trout by applying an EPA-approved piscicide (rotenone). Warm Creek and Soda Butte Creek picnic areas will also be closed for project staging. View a map for details.

Cutthroat trout will be moved out of the treatment area the week of Aug. 7 by electroshocking. The salvaged cutthroat trout will be held in the Soda Butte Creek watershed in upper untreated tributaries.

Cutthroat trout will be released back into Soda Butte Creek once fisheries staff complete the treatment.

<u>Cutthroat trout</u> are the only trout species native to the park. They are the most ecologically important fish of the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem and are highly regarded by anglers. Genetically pure Yellowstone cutthroat trout populations have declined throughout their natural range in the Intermountain West, succumbing to competition with and predation by nonnative fish species, a loss of genetic integrity through hybridization, habitat degradation and predation.

## Fishing Restrictions Lifted on Some Streams in Southwest Montana

HELENA – Fishing restriction and closures on several streams in southwest Montana have been lifted because of recent cool temperatures and forecasted rain.

This includes the hoot owl restrictions on the lower Beaverhead River, four sections on the Big Hole River, the lower Gallatin River, Jefferson River, the lower Madison River and Ruby River. This also includes lifting the full closure on the Madison below Ennis Dam.

Fishing restrictions, such as hoot owl restrictions and full fishing closures, are designed to protect fish that become more susceptible to disease and mortality when conditions, such as low flows and high water temperatures, combined with other stressors, including catch-and-release fishing.

All stress to fish at this time of year is cumulative, and anglers should consider fishing in cooler waters during times of low flows and high water temperatures in rivers. Anglers can help reduce stress for fish by following these practices when catching and releasing fish, though fish mortality may still occur:

- Fish during the coolest times of day, where permitted.
- Land the fish quickly.
- Wet your hands before handling the fish.
- Keep the fish in water as much as possible.
- Remove the hook gently. Using artificial lures with single and barbless hooks can make hook removal faster and easier.
- If the fish is hooked deeply, you may have to cut the line at the fish's mouth or consider keeping it if regulations allow.
- Let the fish recover before releasing it.

## O.T.O. Dude Ranch Open House Welcomes Community Back to Historic Ranch

Gardiner, MT (August 4, 2023) — On Saturday, August 19, local community members and visitors are invited back to the historic O.T.O. Dude Ranch for an Open House to tour the ranch and learn about its part in the history of dude ranching and its current role as wildlife habitat. Managed by Custer Gallatin National Forest, the O.T.O. is Montana's first dude ranch and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

This year's O.T.O. Dude Ranch Open House will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., with tours of the ranch and educational opportunities presented by Custer Gallatin National Forest. Food and beverages will be available for purchase. Ticket sales from a raffle for a threenight dude ranch vacation from Ranch Preservation, which manages the True Ranch Collection of historic ranches in the West, will be donated to the Yellowstone Community Fund. Please note, this will be a cash-only event.

Last year's Open House welcomed members of the community to the historic ranch, with over 600 visitors traveling from all over the state.

This summer, the O.T.O. was utilized for a second season of Ranch Preservation's Yellowstone Pop-Up Ranch. The pop-up events, produced in cooperation with Custer Gallatin National Forest, have welcomed dudes back to the ranch after it was closed to guests for 80 years. Ranch Preservation brought in horses, staff and décor to operate the ranch as a dude ranch for seven weeks. Event proceeds benefit the preservation and restoration of the O.T.O.

At the open house, guests will be able to tour the main lodge and ranch cabins styled true to how they once were with cozy furnishings, animal mounts and Navajo rugs.

Due to the narrow, one-lane mountain road that accesses the O.T.O., visitors should be prepared for one-way timed travel restrictions upon arrival to and departure from the ranch. Vehicles will be permitted to drive from the Cedar Creek Trailhead to the O.T.O. on each hour of the event for 15 minutes, beginning from 9 a.m. to 9:15 a.m. Departures from the ranch will take place 30 minutes past each hour. Visitors should plan their travel times accordingly or can plan to park at the Cedar Creek Trailhead and hike to the ranch, approximately 1.5 miles up the road.




