3.1 Bear Creek Council Letter

Our Mission statement is what we refer to in situations like this: The Gardiner Chamber of Commerce serves our community through developing local tourism while endorsing stewardship of the Yellowstone Ecosystem.

The Chamber Board has been approached by Chamber Member, Bear Creek Council to write a letter to FWP opposing the hunting of Grizzly Bears should delisting move forward.

Review of the fact:

So many people are coming here to see the animals, this tourism is what drives our overall economy.

If there is a hunt the limit would be seven. Sixty-one were killed by the states as problem bears.

We support due process. We took a stand on the mining as pro air, wildlife and clean water if anything can be done without impacting this, then so be it.

Schalene did speak to the Jackson Hole Chamber President. We will be following our procedure. Schalene feels that the letter is fine.

We would poll -support or not support the Chamber writing a letter to FWP that would go something like this:

"We as your Board have been approached by chamber member Bear Creek Council to take a stand regarding....... We want to find out if our members want the Chamber to take a stand against Grizzly Bear hunting."

We will send out the poll question. Barb and Hal get that statement /question prepared with Nathan Varley involved too. Indicate that the ask came from the Bear Creek Council. Put a reminder to Membership in the newsletter to chamber members to check their email and vote.

Schalene brought up that Anna had offered to call members to tell them to check their email since we have concerns regarding the number of members that respond to our questions. We just want to do the right thing. Put on website, Facebook page and in newsletter. But there are concerns as to the dialogue the caller would use.

Ultimately we want the protection of economy and avoid bad press.

3.2 Winter Business

Discussion regarding our push for businesses to stay open in winter in light of new information: Xanterra has cancelled some winter tours and what that means for Gardiner, also transportation issues that visitors face when they want to come to Gardiner any time of year.

Winter reservations for Xanterra winter tours out of Mammoth have not been what they were hoping for so they have cancelled or reduced some of their tours into the Northern Range and down to Canyon.

Also, there are issues of transportation making it very difficult for people who want to come here and spend a few days in Gardiner before going into the interior if they don't want to rent a car and have it sit in the parking lot for days.

There is talk of a local trying to set up as an UBER driver which will be helpful if they can accomplish it.

4. New Business Action Items

4.1 Chamber Political Endorsement

Discussion and vote on whether the Chamber should endorse local resident Bill Berg for Park County Commissioner.

Sabina thinks that The Board should endorse Bill Berg for Commission.

Schalene: Bill is great and for our county and Gardiner but she feels like what if someone comes to use and asks us to endorse for Governor or President.

Sabina the person running would need to be a chamber member and in good standing. Endorse as the Board.

Sabina -Motion to support Bill as a candidate for Park County Commissioner as the Chamber Board. Schalene second.
