Phase 2 of the Gardiner Gateway Project is currently out for solicitation to the Yellowstone, Grand Teton and surrounding area Multiple Award Task Order Contracting (MATOC) contractors as of January 26th, 2016. The solicitation period ends on February 25th, 2016.

If your firm is not a listed MATOC contractor, you cannot submit a bid as a prime contractor. We encourage non-MATOC firms to consider the many subcontracting opportunities.

Launch of the Audio Collection with Sounds from Yellowstone

Yellowstone National Park and the Acoustic Atlas at Montana State University Library announced today the launch of the Yellowstone Collection, a curated compilation of field recordings and a developing podcast series highlighting America's first national park.

Through a cooperative project between the Acoustic Atlas and Yellowstone National Park, the growing audio collection aims to create new ways to experience the animals, landscapes, and people of the area, by offering a freely accessible online archive of natural sounds, interviews, and radio stories focused on the Greater Yellowstone Eco-system.

“We could not be more excited to share the sounds of Yellowstone through our archive,” Kenning Arlitsch, Dean of the Montana State University Library, said. “Montana State University Library launched the Acoustic Atlas because there are relatively few natural sound collections at libraries, and even fewer focusing on the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem.” The Acoustic Atlas was founded in 2013 and includes recordings from throughout the Western United States. The Yellowstone collection builds on its mission to document the sounds of regional ecosystems.

In addition to expanding the natural sounds collection at MSU, the field recordings will be used as a foundation in creating sound-rich, podcast-style audio pieces that tell the stories of research and issues in Yellowstone National Park. The audio stories, which visitors and followers can listen to online, will highlight the rich, but changing, soundscapes of the area, chronicle some of the research taking place in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem and spotlight key voices in the region. Project producer and Yellowstone National Park correspondent Jennifer Jerrett says, “It’s kind of like public radio for Yellowstone National Park. I hope these stories build perspective and advance our conversations about science and the complexities of preservation in Yellowstone.” Jerrett continues, “2016 marks the National Park Service Centennial, so it seems fitting to stop and listen—to really listen—and reflect on the meaning of parks and preservation in America. I’m proud to be working on such an extraordinary project.”

The project is supported in part by Montana State University, the Yellowstone Association, the Yellowstone Park Foundation, and by a generous grant through the Eyes on Yellowstone program. Eyes on Yellowstone is made possible by Canon U.S.A., Inc. This program represents the largest corporate donation for wildlife conservation in the park. Audio from the partnership can be accessed through both the [Yellowstone National Park](#) and [Acoustic Atlas](#) websites.

Custer Gallatin National Forest Kicks Off Forest Plan Revision Community Public Meetings Across the Forest

Bozeman, MT – The 3.1 million acre, Custer Gallatin National Forest is starting Forest Plan Revision, with a series of community public meetings across the forest. Ultimately, the four-year Forest Plan Revision process gives way to a new Forest Plan, a comprehensive overarching document providing guidance for forest management on the Custer Gallatin National Forest for years to come. Involvement in the Forest Plan early and often helps to create the vision for the surrounding National Forest System lands in the coming decade.

“Over the next four years the Forest Plan needs to bring together ecological social and economic interests,” said Virginia Kelly, Forest Plan Revision Team Leader. “Communities and the Forest Service will work together to determine what that means across the Custer Gallatin National Forest.”

Final venue locations will be forthcoming in update. Forest Plan Revision meetings will be the first opportunity for the public to provide local knowledge and information about current conditions, trends, perceptions and concerns, while also introducing the Forest Plan Revision team to communities around the Custer Gallatin National Forest.

Meetings will begin with a brief introduction and overview of the Forest Plan Revision process and understanding the Custer Gallatin National Forest as a whole, along with the identification of important interests in communities. Following the presentation the Custer Gallatin planning team will be available for questions and to speak one-on-one with citizens.

Environmental Assessment available for Public Comment

The Use of Quarantine to Identify Brucellosis-free Yellowstone Bison for Relocation Elsewhere

The National Park Service has completed an Environmental Assessment (EA) that evaluates various alternatives for a quarantine program for Yellowstone bison. The purpose of a quarantine program would be to augment or establish new tribal and public populations of plains bison to assist in the conservation of the species as wildlife, support cultural and nutritional opportunities for Native Americans, and reduce the number of Yellowstone bison shipped to processing facilities.

The EA was prepared in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) to provide the decision-making framework to evaluate a range of alternatives for potential implementation of a quarantine program, including the location(s), of one or more quarantine facilities, guidelines for implementing quarantine, and the scale at which quarantine may be conducted.

A public "Open House-style" meeting will be held to explain, clarify, discuss, and solicit comments on the plan/EA. The meeting will be held:
