

HELENA – No fishing licenses will be required Mother's Day weekend, May 13 and 14. So grab your gear and your gal and head out to enjoy Montana's countless rivers, streams, lakes and reservoirs. In 2021, Gov. Greg Gianforte signed into law Senate Bill 61, which makes it free to fish in Montana on Mother's Day. Montanans have enjoyed free fishing on Father's Day weekend for more than 10 years.

Yellowstone National Park's East Entrance Road Now Open

Anticipate temporary road closures near Sylvan Pass due to increased avalanche danger

The Road from the East Entrance near Cody, Wyoming, to Fishing Bridge Junction (Sylvan Pass), and Canyon Village to Lake Village, opened on Friday, May 5 to public motor vehicle traffic.

The public are asked to:

- Anticipate temporary road closures near Sylvan Pass because of increased avalanche danger from recent snowfall and warm temperatures.
- Watch for quickly changing weather conditions.
 Many areas of the park are still experiencing winter conditions and snow and ice may cover sections of road.
- Stay informed about up-to-date road conditions in Yellowstone:
- Visit <u>Park Roads</u>.
- Call (307) 344-2117 for recorded information.
- Receive Yellowstone road alerts on your mobile phone by texting "82190" to 888-777 (an automatic text reply will confirm receipt and provide instructions).
- Come prepared. Services in the spring are limited. Visit <u>Operating Hours & Seasons</u> for area-specific season opening dates.

Stay at least 100 yards away from bears and wolves, and 25 yards from all other wildlife. Do not crowd or push wildlife. Due to a severe winter of above-average snowpack, wildlife such as bison, elk and moose are stressed and weak. Be mindful as they endure this hardest part of the year. Bison and elk often use roads as travel corridors when the snow is deep, and higher than usual snowbanks this year prevent them from easily moving off the road.

More park roads to open

Roads to open May 12 at 8 a.m. include:

- South Entrance to West Thumb
- West Thumb to Lake Village
- West Thumb to Old Faithful (Craig Pass)
- Tower Junction to Tower Fall

Road to open May 26 at 8 a.m. includes:

• Canyon Village to Tower Fall (Dunraven Pass)

Park roads open year-round

The park's North Entrance (Gardiner, Montana) and Northeast Entrance (Silver Gate and Cooke City, Montana) are open year-round to all traffic with no restrictions. Both road corridors have been repaired after last year's <a href="https://linear.com/historic/histor

Who: Any preschooler turning 5 on or before September 10, 2023 and their parents/guardians



Yellowstone National Park Reminds Boaters, Anglers to Clean, Drain and Dry Stop the spread of aquatic invasive species

MAMMOTH HOT SPRINGS, WY – Boating and fishing season begins in Yellowstone National Park on Saturday, May 27 and ends Oct. 31. Boaters and anglers can protect Yellowstone's waters by following clean, drain and dry guidelines to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species (AIS).

Clean, drain and dry all boats, trailers and equipment prior to arriving in the park to minimize the risk of introducing AIS into Yellowstone's waters. Watercraft equipped with sealed internal ballast tanks are banned from all park waters as inspections cannot always detect aquatic invaders in these types of boats. In addition, felt-soled footwear is banned because they can carry microscopic disease organisms even after cleaning.

Clean, Drain, Dry

Clean all plants, animals, mud, sand and other debris from your boat, anchor, boots and equipment. Use high-pressure, hot (120-140F) water if possible.

Drain all water from your boat, including the motor, bilge, livewell and other compartments before you arrive. Leave drain plugs out during transport. Do not move water or organisms from one water body into another.

Dry all compartments and equipment in the sun for five days.

Clean, drain and dry requirements are critical steps to protect the park's and nation's waterways.

Aquatic invasive species (AIS) and nonnative organisms pose a grave and growing threat to Yellowstone National Park and the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem.

AIS can quickly and drastically transform habitats and food chains, causing permanent declines in fish and food resources for native wildlife. Preventing the introduction of AIS is critical as eradication is costly and usually impossible.

Growing Threats

Dreissenid Mussels, including Zebra and Quagga Mussels, are among the world's most harmful invasive species, with large and widespread ecological and economic effects. If Zebra or Quagga mussels are found in Yellowstone, park waters may close to all watercraft to prevent the spread to other waterways. Yellowstone National Park straddles the Continental Divide and headwaters that flow from the park drain to the Pacific and Atlantic oceans. Invasion of park waters by invasive mussels would mean devastating effects on the park's thriving and diverse aquatic ecosystem, and detrimental impacts to recreation, waterways and communities downstream.

People are encouraged to report violations and potential discoveries of AIS. The park will continue efforts to develop an AIS Management Plan and Rapid Response Framework.

Permits and Inspections

Watercraft and angler float tubes must have a Yellowstone National Park AIS inspection and permit prior to launching in park waters. Permits and inspections are available for purchase 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. seven days per week during the summer season at the following locations:

Motorized and non-motorized watercraft (including angler float tubes and paddle boards)

- Bridge Bay Ranger Station
- Grant Marina
- Lewis Lake Ranger Station

- Angler float tubes onlyWest Yellowstone Visitor Information Center
- **Bechler Ranger Station**
- Mammoth Backcountry Office
- Northeast Entrance Station
- Grant Backcountry Office

Watercraft with evidence of dead or live quagga or zebra mussels will not be allowed to launch into Yellowstone waters.

Yellowstone fishing permits can be purchased at in-park stores, vendors in surrounding communities or online via Recreation. gov.

DO NOT FEED THE WILDLIFE

"Feeding wildlife is often undertaken with good intentions," said Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks Game Management Bureau Chief Brian Wakeling. "Despite those good intentions, providing artificial food for wildlife can have a number of negative consequences for wildlife and humans."

Artificial feeding can alter natural movements, migrations and concentrations of wildlife, Wakeling explained. Due to the availability of artificial foods, wildlife may alter migration timing, which may place them at greater risk of mortality when seasonal changes become more extreme.

Artificial feeding also can create unnatural concentrations of wildlife, which may subsequently create greater opportunity for disease transmission and draw in predators, such as mountain lions.

If the artificial food is near human habitation, concentrations of wildlife may result in undesirable effects on vegetation or landscapes and create conflicts among neighboring landowners.

These changes also may present challenges for domestic animals, especially small pets.

"In short, artificial feeding may create far more challenges for the wildlife we feed or among neighbors who may have different interests in wildlife," Wakeling said.

And, even with the best intentions, feeding wildlife is illegal."

But most importantly hear how together, the Park and the Gateway Communities persevered and are ready to play host to visitors as we head into summer at and around America's First National Park.

Custer Gallatin N.F. Received Full Funding — Flooding Two Sources: Emergency Repair of Federally Owned Roads & Federal Disaster Relief Funds

Bozeman, MT- May 9, 2023 - The Custer Gallatin National Forest recently received funding from the Federal Disaster Relief and received confirmation from the Federal Highways Administration which oversees the Emergency Repair of Federally Owned Roads (ERFO program) that the Forest will receive the full requested funding for the June 2022 flooding. Repair work is wide-spread with transportation system repairs totaling over \$22.8 million and recreation-related facilitates, trails, trail bridges and watershed-related work totaling almost \$17 million.

In June 2022, the Custer Gallatin National Forest, alongside numerous communities, and Yellowstone National Park, saw historical flooding. The naturally occurring event significantly changed areas of the landscape and the Forest is prepared for a multi-year restoration effort.

"We are filled with gratitude to be receiving this confirmation of funding for last year's substantial flooding impacts," said Mary Erickson, Custer Gallatin Forest Supervisor. "We acknowledge the importance of this landscape to all the communities that live alongside and receive benefits from these public lands. The Forest is prepared for the restoration effort with priority to high-use recreation areas important to communities, access to private lands and homes adjacent to forest, and permitted facilities such as church camps, campgrounds, and recreation residences."

Considerations influencing when projects are implemented include amount and type of available funding, scope and scale of repairs needed, contractor availability, and the relative importance of affected sites to people across the Forest. For 2023 permanent repairs are expected for the following sites:

- East Rosebud Road (initially milepost 7.3) completed in stages over the next 1-3 years (temporary access in 2023.)
- Lake Fork Road Bridge
- Westminster Spires Bridge
- Stillwater Trailhead Reconstruction
- Richel Lodge Bridge
- Main Fork Rock Creek Road repairs to Glacier Lake Trailhead (excluding new bridges)
- Lake Fork Trailhead Bridge
- Snow Creek Bridge

Gardiner and Yellowstone Ranger District

- Yankee Jim River Access and Joe Brown Trailhead (Gardiner)
- Mill Creek and West Fork Mill Creek
- Main Boulder Area Recreation Sites

Hebgen Lake Ranger District

Grayling Creek Snowmobile Bridge
