General Season Reaches Midpoint with Mixed Hunter Success in Southwestern Montana

BOZEMAN – Montana's general hunting season has reached the midpoint this week with steady hunter numbers and mixed success rates as recorded at game check stations in southwestern Montana.

Wildlife biologists with Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks use check stations to collect data on hunter participation and success, as well as the species, sex and age class of the animals harvested. This supplements data collected through hunter harvest phone surveys each year.

On Nov. 4 and 5, biologists operated four check stations in the region and met with 995 hunters. Those hunters collectively harvested five white-tailed deer, 26 mule deer and 36 elk, among other species. Most areas had relatively mild weather over the weekend.

The Alder check station saw 235 hunters and a success rate of 11.4 percent. The long-term averages for the third weekend at this check station are 234 hunters and a success rate of 14 percent.

The Cameron check station saw 377 hunters, 5.3 percent of whom were successful. The long-term averages for the third weekend at this check station are 344 hunters and a success rate of 8.4 percent.

The Divide check station saw 165 hunters, 11.5 percent of whom were successful. The long-term averages for the third weekend at this check station are 214 hunters and a success rate of 6.9 percent.

The Mill Creek check station saw 218 hunters and a success rate of 2.2 percent. The long-term averages for the third weekend at this check station are 197 hunters and a success rate of 4.2 percent.

These figures do not account for different hunting season regulations over the years, which have varied from liberal to restrictive for elk and mule deer, depending on population status.

Be bear aware

FWP reminds hunters that bears will remain active throughout the general season, and hunters should be prepared for bear encounters. Montana is bear country. Grizzly bear populations continue to become denser and more widespread in Montana, increasing the likelihood that residents and recreationists will encounter them in more places each year.

People who hunt in places that have or may have grizzly bears—which includes areas of Montana west of Billings—should take special precautions:

Carry bear spray and practice to be prepared to use it immediately.

- Look for bear sign and be cautious around creeks and areas with limited visibility.
- Hunt with a group of people. Making localized noise can help alert bears to your presence.
- Be aware that elk calls and cover scents can attract bears.
- Bring the equipment and people needed to help field dress game and remove the meat from the kill site as soon as possible.
- If you need to leave part of the meat in the field during retrieval, hang it at least 10 feet off the ground and at least 150 yards from the gut pile. Leave it where it can be observed from a distance of at least 200 yards.
- Upon your return, observe the meat with binoculars. If it has been disturbed or if a bear is in the area, leave and call FWP.







Trail Stewardship Grant Program 2024 Application Cycle Opened November 1

HELENA – Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks is accepting applications for the Trail Stewardship Grant Program from Nov. 1 to Jan. 15.

TSP grants can fund the development, renovation, and maintenance of motorized and nonmotorized recreational trails and trailside facilities. This state-funded program will award approximately \$2 million during the 2024 funding cycle.

Applicants may request up to \$100,000 with a 10 percent required match. *Grant applicants may include tribal, state, county, municipal or federal agencies, school districts, and nonprofit recreational organizations and clubs.* An organization can submit only one grant application per grant cycle.

A webinar training and a question-and-answer session will be held on Wednesday, Nov. 8, at 2:30 p.m. This session is highly recommended for new and returning applicants. The training will provide helpful information on program requirements and tips on writing a competitive application and using the grant management software. The training will be held via Zoom. Montana Wildlife & Transportation Partnership Project Program Fall 2023 Application Cycle is Open The Montana Wildlife & Transportation Partnership

The Montana Wildlife & Transportation Partnership is accepting project proposals through November 30

The Montana Wildlife and Transportation Partnership (MWTP or the partnership) is accepting applications for collaborative, stand-alone projects that can help reduce wildlife vehicle conflicts within the state's highway infrastructure.

This is the second project application cycle, and project proposals can be submitted through Nov. 30.

MWTP is a collaborative group of representatives from the Montana Department of Transportation (MDT), Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks (FWP), and Montanans for Safe Wildlife Passage (MSWP). Formed in 2019, the partnership recognized that reducing wildlife-vehicle collisions (WVC) and improving connectivity means finding ways to accommodate safe wildlife movement across highways. The project program launched by MWTP earlier this spring is a statewide project application process for the public to propose collaborative, stand-alone wildlife accommodation projects within the state's highway infrastructure.

This public-private partnership program addresses the need for transportation projects dedicated to accommodating wildlife and improving motorist safety on Montana state highways with the collaborative engagement of stakeholders, including leveraging capacity and capital investment.

Collaboration is essential to focus public-private resources as groups prepare applications for the project program. The application process requires coordination, time, and investment. Throughout the spring and summer, the partnership has provided resources, webinars, and communications to assist potential applicants in understanding the program and the application requirements. Please visit the MWTP webpage at https://www.mdt.mt.gov/pubinvolve/mwt/ to be sure you have the latest information. Potential applicants are encouraged to contact partnership members through the Contact Us link (mdt.mwtp@mt.gov) on the website to ask questions and seek assistance specific to their project proposal and application.

The online, fillable application form is available on the MWTP website beginning Nov. 1. Once an application is received, MWTP will evaluate project proposals and select stand-alone wildlife accommodation projects that reduce WVCs and improve safe wildlife passage across Montana highways. MWTP will then support selected applicants through the study and development phases.

MWTP is eager to receive your project applications. Consult with local FWP or MDT biologists and focus on partnerships, information sharing, and finer scale data gathering to support purpose, need, benefit, and proposed solutions in your application. Working together to leverage information, capacity, and resources, will allow more good work through collaboration to address wildlife and transportation challenges in Montana.
