Man Gored by Bison in Yellowstone National Park

Always stay 25 yards away from bison

MAMMOTH HOT SPRINGS, WY – On May 4, 2025, a 47-year-old man from Cape Coral, Florida, was injured by a bison in Yellowstone National Park.

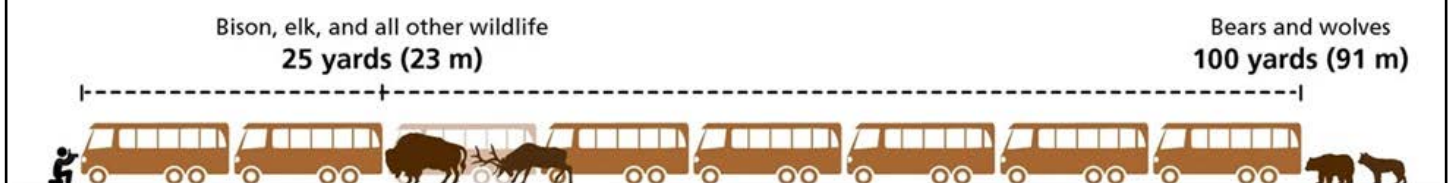
At approximately 3:15 p.m. in the Lake Village area of the park, a man was gored by a bison after he approached it too closely. The individual sustained minor injuries and was treated by emergency medical personnel. The incident is currently under investigation, and no further details are available at this time.

This is the first reported incident of a person injured by a bison in 2025. There were two reported incidents in 2024 and one in 2023.

Wildlife in Yellowstone are wild and can be dangerous

- Wild animals can be aggressive if people don't respect their space. It is your responsibility to stay more than 25 yards (23 meters) away from all large animals – bison, elk, bighorn sheep, deer, moose, and coyotes – and at least 100 yards (91 meters) away from bears and wolves. If wildlife approach you, move away to always maintain these safe viewing distances.
- Bison will defend their space when threatened and have injured more people in Yellowstone than any other animal. They are unpredictable and can run three times faster than humans.

Interagency Bison Management Plan Partners to Meet Virtually May 14

BOZEMAN – Partner agencies in the Interagency Bison Management Plan will meet virtually on May 14 for their annual spring meeting.

The meeting will be held over Zoom, and the link is available on the IBMP’s new website, ibmpinfo.org. There will be a public feedback session during the meeting. Individuals who wish to provide feedback must register online by May 13 at 11:59 p.m. Mountain Time.

The IBMP was signed in 2000 to coordinate bison and brucellosis management between the State of Montana and Yellowstone National Park. The plan was developed by the National Park Service; the U.S. Forest Service; the U.S. Department of Agriculture’s Animal & Plant Health Inspection Service; the Montana Department of Livestock; and Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks. In 2009, three tribal entities were added as partners: the Confederated Salish & Kootenai Tribes, the InterTribal Buffalo Council, and the Nez Perce Tribe.

FWP is hosting the May 14 meeting as the IBMP’s lead partner for 2025.

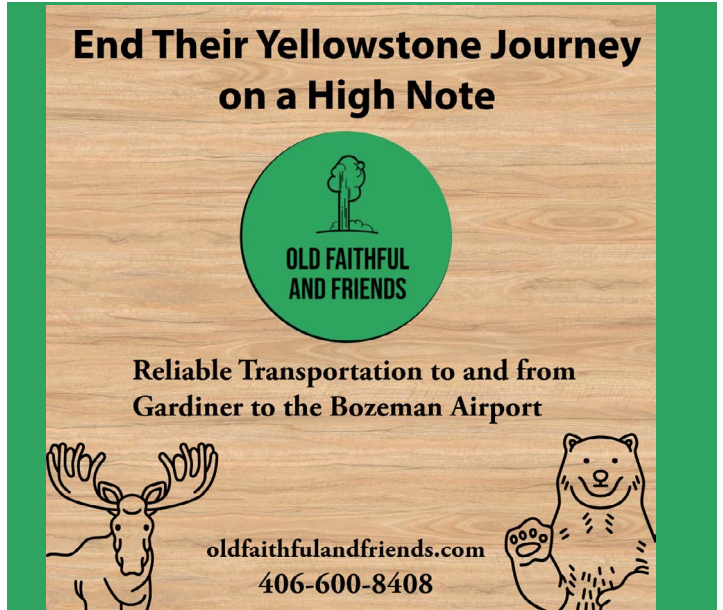

After a three-year battle with MDS blood cancer, Linda K. Carney passed away unexpectedly on December 23rd, with her husband, Reggie, the love of her life, and her close friend, Karin Occhialini, by her side.

Linda was born and raised in Lake Ronkonkoma, NY by her mother Sonia and father James. From her youth, she was a vibrant and active individual, heavily involved in Girl Scouts and a four-sport athlete. She spent countless hours playing sports with her beloved male cousins on Avenue C. She attended Concord College (now Concord University) in West Virginia, where she was a proud member of the Alpha Sigma Alpha sorority. Upon graduation, Linda dedicated 35 years to Sayreville High School, from 1970-2005, as a physical education and sex education teacher and a passionate coach for gymnastics, cross country, and spring track.

Retirement allowed Linda to pursue her lifelong passion for wildlife photography in the stunning landscapes of the Pacific Northwest, particularly Yellowstone. Her many trips to Yellowstone culminated in a move to Gardiner, MT with Reg in May 2015. Linda quickly became a local celebrity, captivating not only photographers but also her fellow Gardiner residents. Her photography was both remarkable and heartfelt, and although many encouraged her to sell her images, she always maintained that it was a cherished hobby. Her work graced the covers of *Yellowstone Quarterly* and *Wolves of the Rockies*, and was showcased in an art show at The Frame Garden in Livingston, MT.

Beyond her photographic pursuits, Linda had a spirit for adventure, enjoying white water rafting, including an unforgettable honeymoon trip on the Colorado River and numerous basketball raft trips on the Gauley River in West Virginia. She was also a devoted Duke basketball fan, with a particular fondness for Bobby Hurley. In her leisure time, she thoroughly enjoyed connecting with friends on Facebook and playing Candy Crush and Woodoku.

Linda and Reg were known for their daily three-mile walks, where Linda's warm personality shone. She knew the name of every dog they encountered, and the dogs returned her affection. Her own cats, Napoleon, Oscar, and Sage, were her true companions and she theirs.

Despite her playful teasing of Reg for his chattiness, Linda was a passionate ambassador for Yellowstone Park. She shared her love for the park with everyone she met, drawing upon her teaching expertise to educate families and visitors about its wonders and wildlife. Her beautiful yard, which she often cultivated with neighbors Amy Berndt and Tom Stone, was a source of joy for both visitors and locals.

Linda's unwavering protection of wildlife was legendary. She was known to use her whistle or commanding physical education teacher's voice to correct visitors who were altering animal behavior or blocking their path. While she could be quite vocal, when necessary, her passion served as a powerful reminder to all to preserve the park's beauty and maintain the health of its wildlife.

Linda was preceded in death by her parents. She is survived by her loving husband, Reggie; her brothers, James and John; her nephews, Johnathan and Jimmy; and a vast community of former students and athletes who will forever remember her.

DID YOU KNOW?

1. Montana's income tax system has changed. Taxpayers will see changes to filing statuses, tax brackets, and the calculation of Montana taxable income.
2. As a result, employees should review their wage withholding to ensure they aren't withholding too much or too little.
3. The Department of Revenue has also updated the Montana wage withholding form (Form MW-4). All employees are encouraged to review their wage withholding amounts.

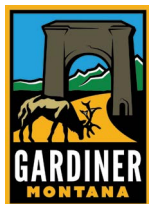
