Gardiner Yellowstone Bridge Project

Project Overview

The Montana Department of Transportation's (MDT) Gardiner Yellowstone Bridge Project will entail the rehabilitation of the bridge deck and its north and south approaches to extend the service life of the structure. While safe to drive, the bridge deck is in poor condition and will continue to deteriorate if no rehabilitation measures are taken. The following improvements are planned:



- Deck milling and concrete overlay on the main bridge surface.
- Deck replacement on the existing north and south approaches to the bridge.
- Deck milling and concrete overlay on the widened portion of the approaches.
- Expansion joint replacement.
- Sidewalk replacement: The project will maintain the existing sidewalks along both sides of the bridge. However, the northwest sidewalk approach will be removed and reset to allow for sidewalk replacement and retaining wall modification.

Project Location

The bridge is located in Gardiner on U.S. Highway 89 spanning the Yellowstone River that runs through the middle of town. Gardiner serves as a major entry point to Yellowstone National Park, which attracts about four million visitors annually.

PHASE 1 Early September 2019 to mid-November 2019
PHASE 2 Early April 2020 to early June 2020

Project Timeline

The project will occur in two phases and MDT has timed construction to minimize impacts on the traveling public, especially motorists visiting the park. Phase 1 will entail rehabilitation of one lane of the bridge and its approaches starting in early September 2019, continuing through mid-November 2019. Phase 2 construction on the opposite lane and approaches will start in early April 2020 and end early June 2020. The construction schedule will avoid most of the peak of tourist season in mid-June, July, and August.

Impacts to the Public

MDT is committed to working with local stakeholders to minimize construction impacts on businesses and the traveling public. For both phases of construction, there will be alternating single-lane traffic with temporary signals on the north and south ends of the bridge. Although traffic control will entail width restrictions, they will not impact RVs and fifth wheels. For wide loads, a detour will also be available using Old Yellowstone Trail Road to cross the Yellowstone River at Corwin Springs seven miles north of Gardiner.

Due to the town setting and the significant volume of pedestrian traffic using the bridge, an ADA-compliant pedestrian detour will be provided during construction. The bridge has a sidewalk on each side of the road and pedestrians will be detoured to one sidewalk during phased bridge construction activities.

Project Updates

August 19, 2019

On Tuesday, September 3, the Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) will start rehabilitation work on the Yellowstone River Bridge in Gardiner, Montana. This first phase of work is scheduled to be completed in November 2019.

According to the National Park Service, at the height of tourist season as many as 60,000 vehicles per month drive over the bridge in Gardiner to enter Yellowstone National Park through the iconic Roosevelt Arch. While serving as the northern gateway to one of America's most popular national parks, the bridge also has a critical local purpose facilitating the flow of vehicles and pedestrians for a town split in half by the Yellowstone River.

"While the bridge is safe to drive on, it's seeing a lot of wear and tear that needs attention," emphasized Paul Cogley, MDT's Project Manager. "Given the amount of traffic the bridge receives, particularly during the summer tourist season, it's important to undertake some rehabilitative measures in order to prevent further deterioration."

"MDT decided to do this project in two phases that are scheduled to minimize impacts to motorists visiting the park as well as locals that rely on the commerce that tourist season brings," clarified Cogley. "Phase One is scheduled from early this September through mid-November and Phase Two is scheduled from early April until early June 2020."

For both phases of construction, there will be alternating single-lane traffic with temporary signals on the north and south ends of the bridge. Although traffic control will entail width restrictions, they will not impact RVs and fifth wheels. For wide loads, a detour also will be available using Old Yellowstone Trail Road to cross the Yellowstone River at Corwin Springs seven miles north of Gardiner. Travelers are encouraged to allow additional travel time to accommodate delays of up to 15 minutes and are reminded to watch for work crews and equipment and to travel at posted speed limits.

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Yellowstone fire danger level raised to "high"

New fire detected

- The parkwide fire danger level for Yellowstone is now high.
- There are no fire restrictions currently in place in the park.
- Campfires are only permitted within established fire rings in campgrounds and some backcountry campsites.
- All campfires must be cold to the touch before abandoning. Soak, stir, feel, repeat.
- On Sunday, August 18, a new lightning-caused wildland fire was detected approximately one mile west of Dunraven Pass.
 - The 0.1-acre Carnelian Fire is smoldering in an area that last burned in 1988.
 - Crews are monitoring the fire.
 - Smoke may be visible from the park road.
 - There are no area, campsite, or trail closures at this time.
- The Greater Yellowstone area is a fire-adapted ecosystem. Fire plays an important role in maintaining the health of this area's wildlife habitat and vegetation.

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Historic Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel reopening

Join us at the celebration

MAMMOTH HOT SPRINGS, WY - The National Park Service (NPS) recently completed an extensive renovation of the Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel in Yellowstone National Park. Join the park and Xanterra Travel Collection in Yellowstone for a ribbon-cutting ceremony and tours on August 30, 2019, from 10-1 p.m. in front of the hotel to celebrate the reopening of this [historic gathering spot](#).

Event details include:

- 10-10:30 a.m. listen to remarks from Yellowstone National Park's superintendent, the project manager, and Xanterra's general manager.
- 11-1 p.m. take a tour of the refurbished hotel led by Xanterra. Tours start in the hotel lobby.
- 11-1 p.m. visit with the NPS in the Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel Map Room about the carefully restored Reamer Map.
- 11:30 a.m. meet a park ranger in the hotel lobby for a one-hour Calling in the Cavalry Walk around Fort Yellowstone.

Yellowstone and Xanterra partnered to preserve the historic look and feel of this important art moderne structure, one of the few in the NPS. With an emphasis towards sustainability and reducing the carbon footprint, utilities, accessibility, and seismic standards were brought up to code. Additionally, highly trained NPS restoration specialists carefully rehabilitated Robert Reamer's famous wooden map in the Map Room. In total, the project brought the "shine" back to this beautiful, elegant gathering space that will operate nearly year-round.

Funded by the NPS, the four-year renovation of the historic Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel totaled about \$30 million. The project is a great example of Yellowstone's ongoing efforts to reduce deferred maintenance and improve the condition of important historic resources. In 2018, Yellowstone reported a deferred maintenance backlog exceeding \$586 million. Park managers believe this is a conservative estimate. The park and its partners will continue making significant investments in a wide range of infrastructure projects in upcoming years.


